Ray Albino's Meatballs

1 lb. ground beef (chuck)

½ lb. ground pork

½ lb. veal (a basic meatloaf mix is about the same)

Eggs

Chopped garlic

Chopped onion Fresh parsley Italian breadcrumbs Italian bread Olive oil

Soak bread in milk, squeeze and mix with meat, eggs, garlic, onion, and parsley. Make the size meatballs desired. Coat meatballs with breadcrumbs and brown in frying pan with the oil. Bake in oven until done.

There are many ideas on the type of meat and the ratio of the mix; ground chuck has the best ratio of lean and fat. You can skip the veal, if needed, but the pork is a must for good, moist meatballs. Using the soaked bread rather than breadcrumbs make the meatballs softer and juicer.


Technology Updating in the Countryside

We will have nearly complete fiber optic coverage in the Town of Lexington by the end of 2019. Round 2 that was approved for MTC includes the hamlet of Lexington, Airport Road, County Route 13, a Jewett extension, and Spruceton Road, along with the connector links along 23A and Route 42 is expected to be completed by the end of 2018.

Round 3 Awards for the New York Broadband public – private partnership grant program allows for MTC's application to cover 513 additional homes in Lexington using state and federal dollars. Round 3 adds to the over 400 homes passed awarded in Round 2 competition and also has a 2-year completion window.

MTC had additional good news concerning the company itself. On the same day that they received their Broadband Round 3 Award announcement, they also formally became a majority employee owned company. The land was rich with wild food and wilder animals, including a mountain lion as vivid as Journey herself. The book's considerable power comes from Foreman's deep understanding of an America two hundred years ago, run on a slave economy.
